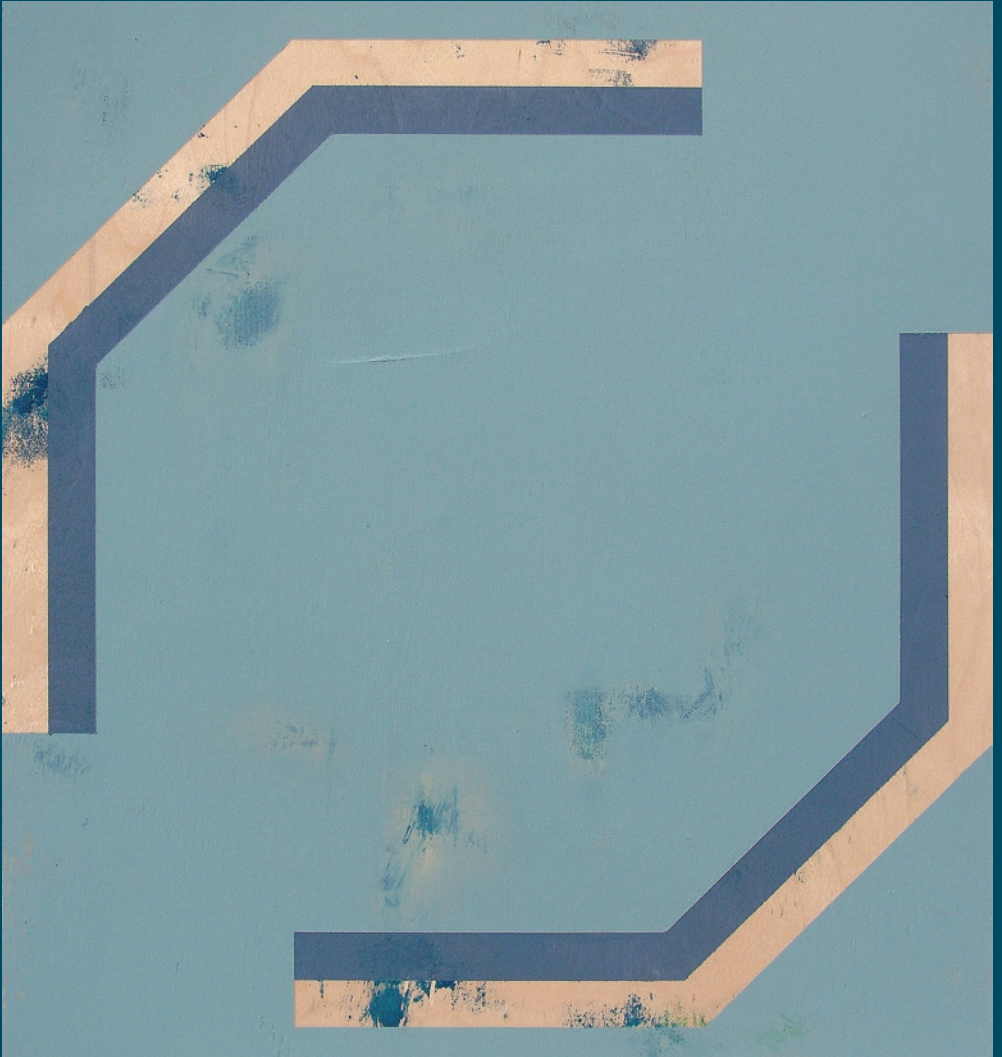

## LEXICON LAB FOR KIDS

### **dlr: Kids do code, run by Claire Hayden of Go4IT**

Lexicon Lab Tuesdays,  
4.00–6.00pm (8–13yrs)

10 sessions designed to explore the use of technology in designing, coding and creating games, animations, apps and more! Kids do code can be completed as a course or you can drop in to the workshops that appeal to you most. Some are aimed at a younger audience (8–12 yrs) while the App inventor and Python workshops are only for older children (10+).

### **Let's get started: 8–12 years**

(Jan 12, 19 & 26)

These basic workshops on computer programming will use Scratch and Blockly to give kids an accessible and fun introduction to coding.

### **Get Gaming: 8–12 years**

These workshops will build on previous coding experience, continuing on with some Scratch work and using add-ons such as the Makey Makey, Raspberry Pi and Kinect to enhance user interactivity.

kids up to a more advanced level of computer programming using App Inventor as a natural step on from Scratch to create their own apps and using Python to introduce fundamental programming concepts through a very user-friendly yet powerful language
