

CLASSIC / HISTORICAL

- ▶ Austen, Jane: Pride and prejudice The very first Chick-lit romance – Will our sassy heroine get with the brooding hero?
- Breslin, Theresa: Prisoner of the Inquisition A gripping, dramatic adventure set during the Spanish Inquisition.
- Donnelly, Jennifer: Revolution

 A pacy adventure for older readers, with appropriately salty language set during the French Revolution
- Hinton, S. E. The Outsiders
 A story of loyalty and friendship set in the 1960s but still relevant today, as teenagers of the urban slums search for personal dignity and a place in the world.
- ▶ Salinger J.D.: Catcher in the rye

 The anti-hero, Holden Caulfields's constant wry observations about what he encounters capture the essence of the eternal teenage experience of alienation.
- ▶ Smith, Dodie: I Capture the castle

 Back in print after an absence of many years, a shimmering timelessness clings to
 the pages of this dreamy and funny novel.
- ▶ Spillebeen, Geert: Age 14; An Irish soldier boy Based on a true story, this faction is about dreams, about war and peace, and the lives lost to achieve both.
- ▶ Tolkien, J.R.R.: Lord of the rings The gospel of the fantasy genre, a story magnificently told, with every kind of colour and movement and greatness.





CONTEMPORARY / ISSUES

- Asher, Jay: Thirteen reasons why
 - Clay Jensen finds a mysterious box, with his name on it, lying on the porch. Inside he discovers 13 cassette tapes recorded by Hannah, his classmate who committed suicide weeks earlier...
- Bailey, Helen: Falling hook, line and sinker Electra has fallen hook, line and sinker for a testosterone-packed hunk. He's cute, he's cool and he's been expelled from school. What more could a girl want?
- ▶ Conrad, Lauren: Sweet little lies (L.A. Candy) In TV star Lauren Conrad's novel about young Hollywood, the lies are only as sweet as the people telling them.
- Dowd, Siobhan: Solace of the road A heartbreaking road trip novel with an unforgettable central character.
- ▶ Naidoo, Beverly: The Other side of truth

 Tackles multiple themes, the right to freedom of speech, the complexities of political asylum, bullying and, ultimately, the strength of the family.
- Rai, Bali: City of ghosts An epic tale of love, war and rebellion. Can the ghosts of the past change the future of the citizens of Amritsar...?
- ▶ Stevens, Kevin: This ain't no video game, kid!

 The debut novel of Kevin Stevens, a US native now living in Blackrock, Dublin, this touches on themes of cultural difference and inner-city problems set in Seattle.





- ▶ Sullivan, Deirdre: Prim improper
 - Hilariously and cleverly written whilst dealing with serious issues through the eyes of a savvy, kooky 13-year-old girl.
- Webb, Sarah: Ask Amy Green teen agony queen: Bridesmaid blitz

Everybody's fave agony queen is back – just ask Amy!



FUTURE / FANTASY

- ▶ Brennan, Sarah Rees: The Demon's covenant
 - Dark humour, romance, magic, nasty heroes with swords, nerdy heroes with guns, a feisty girl and her annoying brother packed with loads of action, mystery and suspense.
- ▶ Clare, Cassandra: Clockwork angel (Infernal devices) Vampires, warlocks and other supernatural folk stalk the gaslit streets of Victorian London.
- Collins, Suzanne: Mockingjay (Hunger Games Trilogy)
 The Hunger Games is set in a future with unsettling parallels to our present.
 Welcome to the deadliest reality TV show ever...
- Delaney, Joseph: The Spook's nightmare (The Wardstone chronicles)
 - A terrifying series about a young boy training to be an exorcist. Not to be read after dark!
- Fitzpatrick, Becca: Hush, hush

 Nora, caught in the middle of a centuries-old battle between the immortal and those that have fallen, will have to pick a side sooner or later...



- ▶ Grant, Michael: Lies (Gone)
 If Stephen King had written Lord of the Flies, it might have been a little like this.
- Kiernan, Celia: The Poison throne (Moorehawke) Young Wynter Moorehawke returns to court with her dying father, but her old home is cloaked with fear...
- Lloyd, Saci: Carbon diaries 2017 A wonderfully mordant look at the coming environmental meltdown.
- Meyer, Stephanie: The Short second life of Bree Tanner (Twilight)
 The riveting story of Bree Tanner, a vampire first introduced in Eclipse, and the
 - darker side of the world she inhabits.

 Ness Patrick Monsters of men (Chaos walking)

 Popular vampire romance series as seen on TV.

 The second part of this romantic and atmospheric tale of werewolves.

- ▶ Muchamore, Robert: Brigands M.C. (CHERUB) James Bond for teenagers, a fast-paced action thriller.
- ▶ Peterson, Will: The Gathering (Triskellion) Last in the trilogy, this combines gripping mystery and archaeological adventure with a paranormal twist.
- ▶ Thompson, Kate: Creature of the night A gritty, hard-hitting tale of disaffected youth, but not without a hint of Kate's signature fantasy.

- Green, John: Paper towns
 A funny and quirky school and road-trip story.

 Jess discovers that fraternising with the A-list isn't all it's cracked up to be...
- ▶ McCombie, Karen: The Past, The present, and the loud, loud girl (Ally's World)
