

What can I do?



You can get a library card in any dlr library when you show photo ID and current proof of address. You can also join online and bring your documents to any branch to collect your library card.

If you are under 18 you will need a parent or guardian to sign your form.

When you join the library you can:

1. Borrow a maximum of **12 items for 3 weeks**. This includes books, DVDs, CDs and games.
2. Renew your loans by phone, online or in a branch up to a maximum of 4 times, unless somebody has reserved one of your items.
3. Borrow and return items in any public library in the Dublin area.
4. Search for an item on a catalogue computer in any library or on our online catalogue at libraries.dlrcoco.ie
5. Reserve up to 12 items at one time.

IT, e-resources and print services



We offer Internet access and Microsoft Office on our computers as well as free WiFi. You can access these services using your library card number and PIN code.

Check out our website for a wide range of online services including: e-books and audio books for downloading, access to international newspapers and magazines, language learning, education courses and research portals. These are all free of charge.

We have colour printing in all libraries.
Colour photocopying is available in most libraries.

We have self-service and mobile printing in most of our libraries. Documents can be emailed directly to the printer and collected at your convenience up to 3 hours later.

There are charges for printing and photocopying services.

How much does it cost?



Membership of dlr Libraries is free.

If items are not renewed or returned by their due date, fines are charged at **5 cent per item per day**. Our optional e-mail alert service will remind you 3 days before the due date.

If you have charges of more than €10 on your library card, you may not be able to use library services.

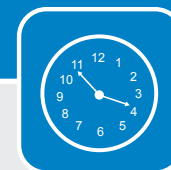
You are responsible for replacing or paying for any items you damage or lose while they are on loan to you. This also applies to anyone for whom you are guarantor for.
