



Vintage Values (Level 5, 23 Sept - 5 Nov) is a collection of pamphlet covers designed and printed in Ireland between the 1920s and 1960s by the Catholic Truth Society in Dublin 1 (now Veritas). The pamphlets were principally for use in the parish to help people seeking advice in a variety of topics such as marriage, sin, dating and social graces. Some of the texts were imported from the USA but all the artwork was created and printed in Ireland and includes work by George Altendorf and John Henry.

ORATORY OF THE SACRED HEART, Dún Laoghaire

CELEBRATING A CENTENARY 1919-2019

The Oratory of the Sacred Heart was built on the grounds of St. Mary's Dominican Convent in 1918 and dedicated to the Sacred Heart in 1919. It commemorates the many local Irishmen who fought and died in the Great War. From 1920-36 it was hand-painted by Sr Concepta Lynch, a Dominican nun at St. Mary's and the result is a stunning example of the Celtic Revival style. This leaflet highlights the events taking place during October and November 2019 to mark the publication of a new book and a new exhibition to showcase the remarkable story of this unique work of art.












PUBLICATION AND EXHIBITIONS

Divine Illumination is the first fulllength publication on this artistic treasure in Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown, a unique three-dimensional tour de force created by Sr Concepta Lynch. The collection of essays includes contributions by Margaret Mac Curtain, Prof Deirdre Raftery and Dr Sighle Bhreathnach-Lynch and sheds new light on the life of this extraordinary woman alongside reproductions of her work that have never been seen before. Supported by Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council, Dept. of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, Dominican Sisters, Cabra and the National Gallery of Ireland.

EXHIBITIONS

A new exhibition based on the publication *Divine Illumination* will be on display on Level 3 at dlr Lexlcon from 11 October 2019-4 January 2020. In addition, the foyer exhibition at the Oratory will be reimagined and the Peace Garden restored by dlr Parks to its former glory.
